From the Principal's Desk

I start my address to all of you with the above quote, as I wish to acknowledge the series of small things that we have successfully managed to undertake in our school in the last five months.

I would like to begin by acknowledging that in an atmosphere of extreme uncertainty and fear, the online classes for the students of Class UKG to X started on 6th April 2020 as per the schedule. We began with the tool Zoom along with Google Classroom and soon shifted to a better tool- Google Classrooms along with Google Meet. Within 2 weeks we had established a system of Broadcast groups to ensure that all the parents received prompt and accurate information from the school besides the updates through the Parent App.

We conducted our first online Survey and then PTM in the month of July 2020 that witnessed as high as 95% parent attendance. By the beginning of June, we had started the process of the teachers conducting small, end of the chapter assessments using Google Forms to assess the level of learning and understanding that was happening. By Mid-July we were receiving amazing short videos of the learning experiments the students have been conducting at home, short speeches, text reading, short dances, and their points of view on different topics discussed by their teachers. The feather in the cap was the creation of original video games by 2 of our students, Sikandar Singh of Class 5 D and Nidhi Rana of Class 7B The videos of these games have been uploaded on the school website for all to see and if anyone wants to play the games the same can also be planned!

It is so encouraging to see and acknowledge the new skills that our students have developed during this time. Online Assembly and online Activities have been a part of the month of August. We have been conducting the same effortlessly and as parents you will get to see the glimpses of many of these in this month's newsletter and some you have attended in person. participating and winning in competitions held outside the school.

Vriddhi Jindal, Ashi Singh, Ananya, Tanveer, Aadhya Rathuri, Sharanya Sharma are a few of the students who have made us proud. Details of the events they participated in have been included in the newsletter.

As you go through the Newsletter, we are gearing up for the First Formal Online Assessment for the students of Class III to X from 14th September 2020. The last 2 weeks or so the students and the teachers been working on developing the skill on attempting a written assignment, scanning the same and sharing it with the teachers using digital tools to check/correct the same. If we are excited by the way the young children have taken to the digital learning, our adults are not far behind. From online teaching to now checking the work of the students online, the learning curve for each one of them- be it students or teachers has been extremely high this time. In the months to come while the situation is still not clear about the reopening of the schools, we are geared up to continue with online classes. We plan to add more activities and events for the students and the parents to participate in with the beginning of Term II of the academic session from 5th October 2020.

In continuation of the acknowledgements it is also very important to say that the true assessment of the student's learning is happening on a daily basis, with the students learning actual life skills- following a pre-decided schedule, making notes of the work done or the work assigned by the teacher, answering questions in the online platform, expressing themselves one by one, listening to and following instructions and sharing and resolving the problems they are facing in the class, along with building language and vocabulary; concepts of Math, Science, Social Studies are not left far behind.

Looking forward to another milestone with the Mid-Term Assessments and the 2nd PTM post that, I will request you all as parents to encourage your children and be with them (especially the ones in Class 3 to 7) as they attempt the Mid-terms. Wishing all the students the best of luck!






Art Integration in EVS


Early human cave paintings!









Art Integration into curriculum








Assembly Class 4 on Independence day

True Freedom is in thoughts and a fearless mind!
























Prakash Utsav Celebration
