From the Principal's Desk



A warm greeting to the SWS parent family!

The note from the Principal's desk for the month of September comes to you from the 3 interesting and positive news I have read in the last few weeks. Firstly the New Education Policy has been released by the Government with many new and much awaited key steps for the department of Education to step up and be in tune with the expanding global trends-no rigid separation between science, arts and commerce; internships & vocational subjects from Class 6; education of gifted children; curriculum to integrate the 21st century skills of mathematical thinking and scientific temper; among many others. Second positive news has been about Mohali where on Tuesday, 22nd September the recovery cases outnumbered the new Covid reported cases. Thirdly, the Government has rolled out strict rules for the possibility of the senior students coming to school voluntarily for their doubt clearing. After a span of nearly six months the students if they wish will be able to meet their teachers (with due social distancing and safety measures). As I wrote in the first sentence these are interesting pieces of news-interesting as it is too preliminary to be able to judge the effect of these whereas the same are much awaited and required.

In the school we have completed the Mid-Term assessments and the teachers are now busy preparing the mark sheets for the students. The Google Forms for the 2nd Parent Teacher Meeting have been rolled out, filled and shared with the school. The next 2-3 weeks will be reflection time in the school wherein we will all reflect on the inputs received from you, our parent family, and readjust where necessary our next steps for the students. We plan to meet the parent for the PTM on 3rd October and begin the 2nd term on 5th October. The online classes will continue with as much gusto as in the 1st term and we aim at bringing in more rigor in the academics especially for the students of Classes 9 & 10.

On the Co-curricular front, class assemblies and Art integration have taken a life of their own as the students and teachers make the screen of the online classes come alive with the prayer, messages and songs. 


Activity on -Water Cycle




Mid Term Assessment


