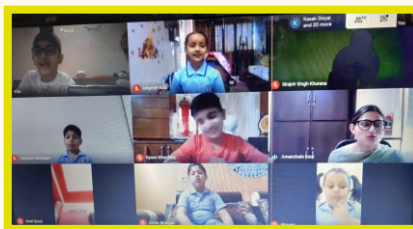
Baisakhi Assembly

Harvest Festivals of India

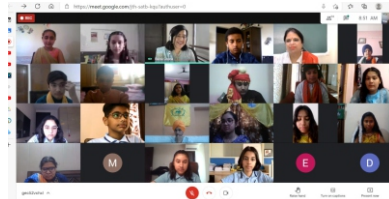
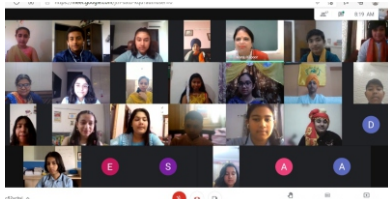
“Plant smiles, Grow laughter and Harvest love” (Class 8)

'Confidence comes from discipline and training'

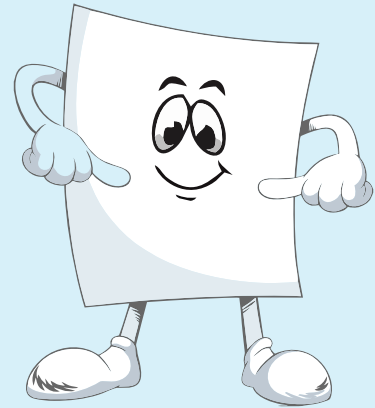

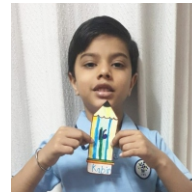
Students were excited to make their own bookmarks and they used it for their book. They enjoyed making the book mark as it was an opportunity for them to display their creativity.

Story Telling

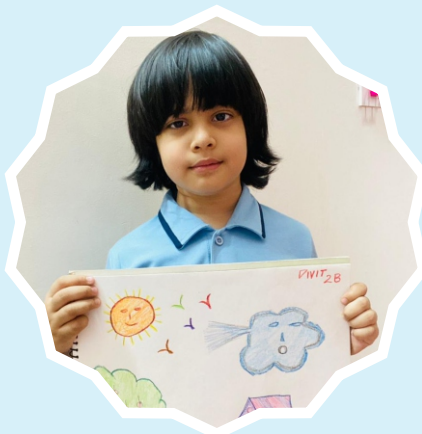
“A good story can imbibe the right values at the most impressionable age.”
