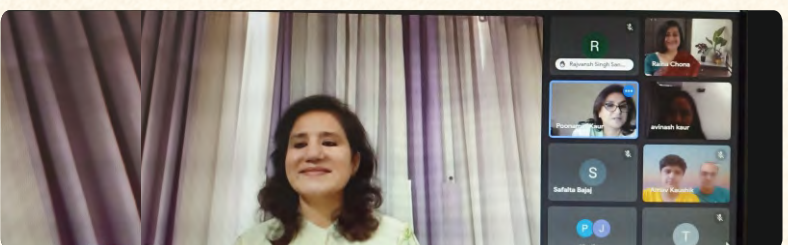
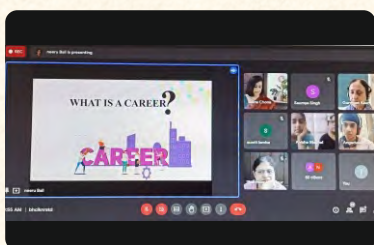
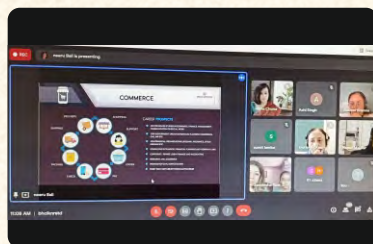
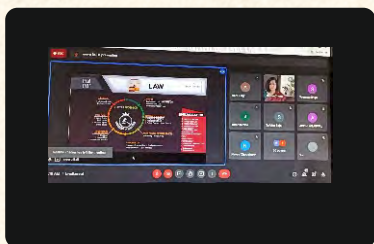
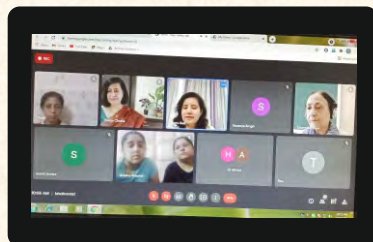
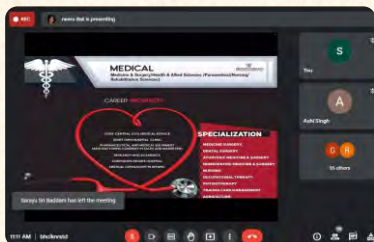
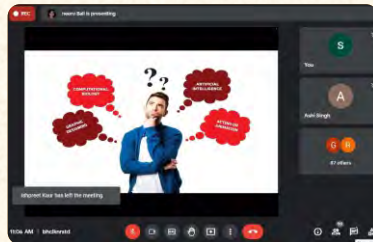
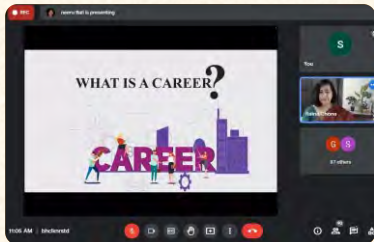
CAREER COUNSELING WORKSHOP AT SWS

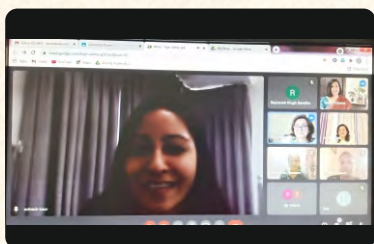

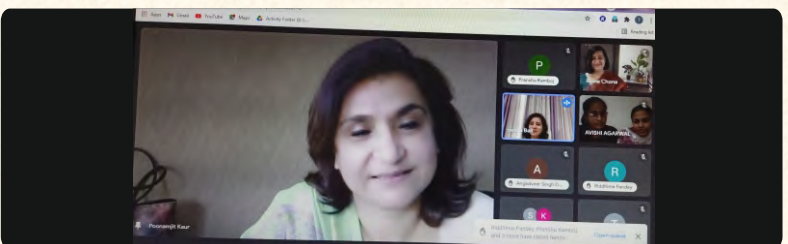

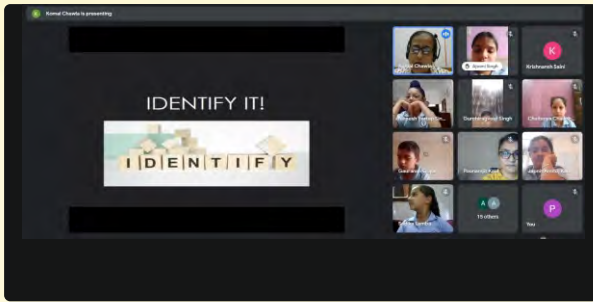


ENGLISH SPELL BEE ACTIVITY

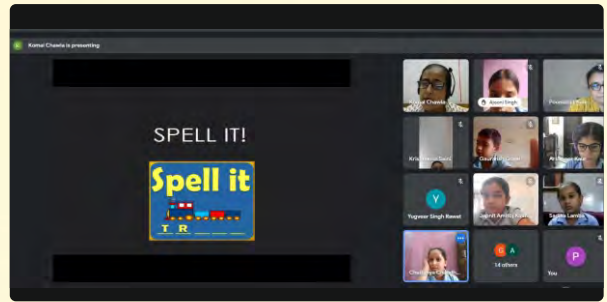

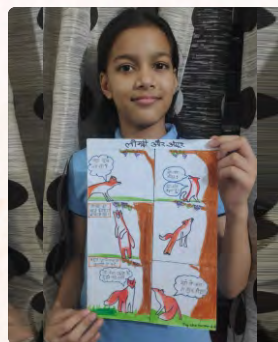
READING MONTH CELEBRATION



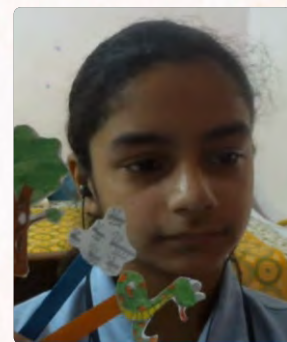

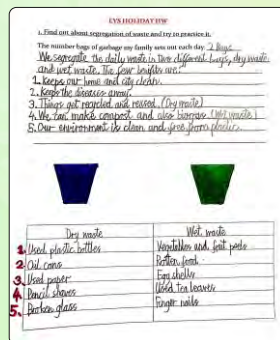
EVS PROJECTS ON WASTE SEGREGATION AND COMPOSTING- CLASS 5

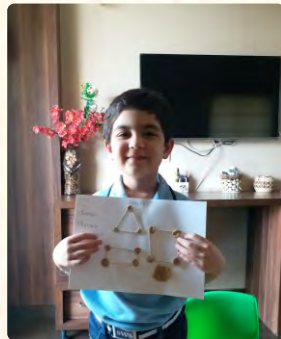
ACTIVITY ON SHAPES



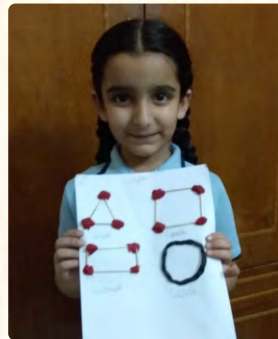

SOCIAL STUDIES

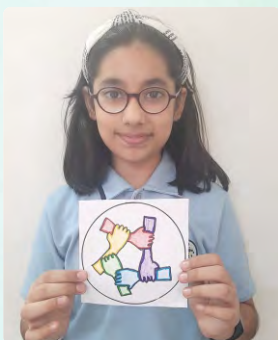

Through this activity, creativity and originality were amazingly expressed by the students. Here are some pictures depicting our enthusiasts.



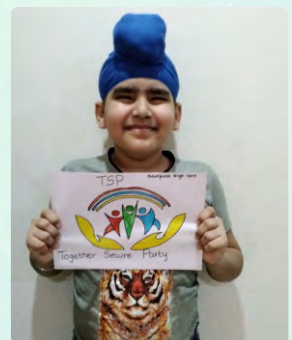

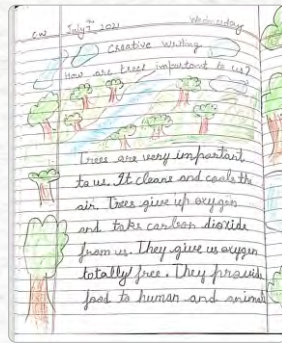
WHAT I LIKE ABOUT NATURE
