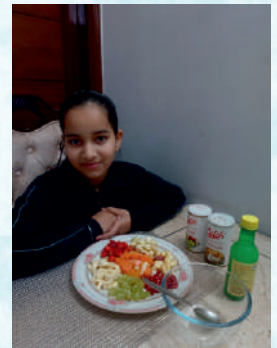

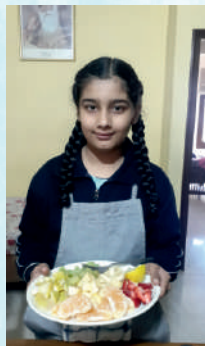

# Clock-Making Activity

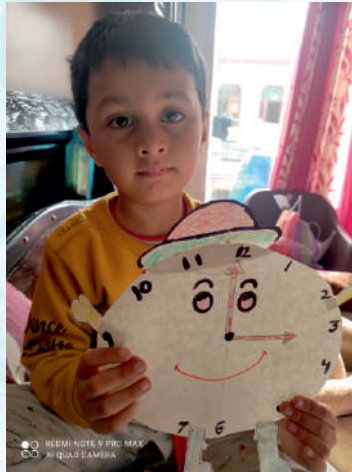

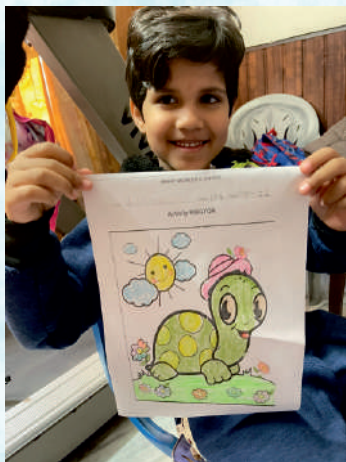




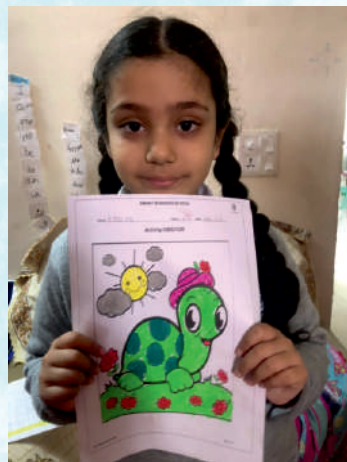


## Vibgyor Activity

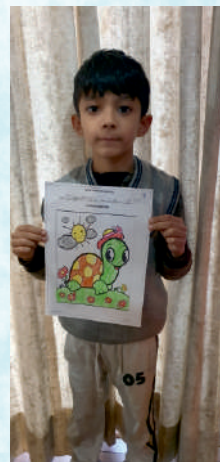

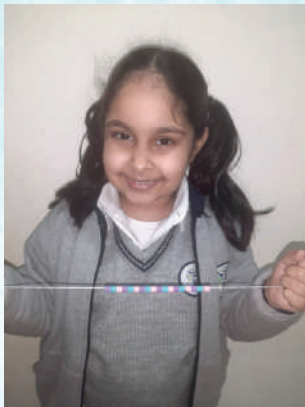


# Patterns Are All Around Us

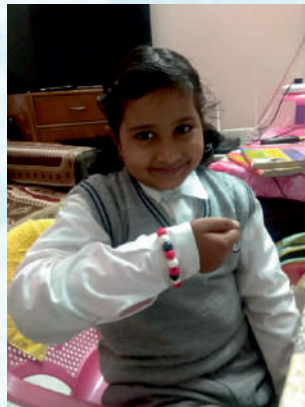
“Math is sometimes called the science of patterns.”-Ronald Graham

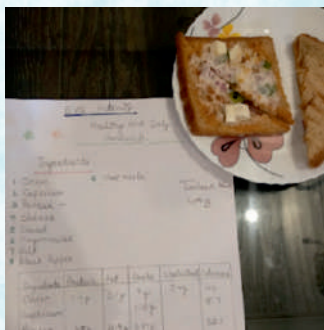




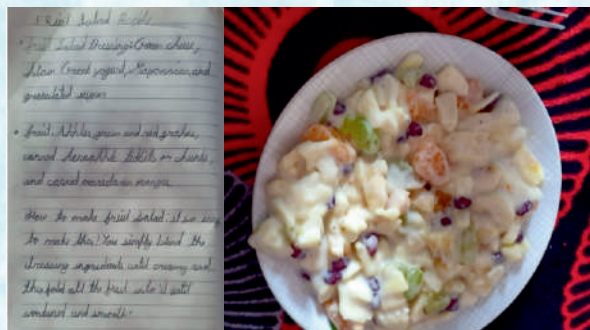


## Healthy Recipe Activity

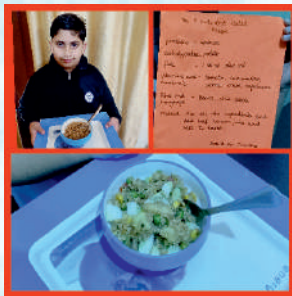

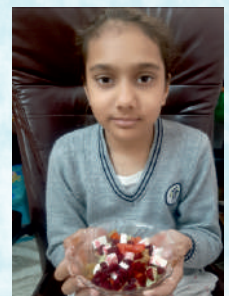

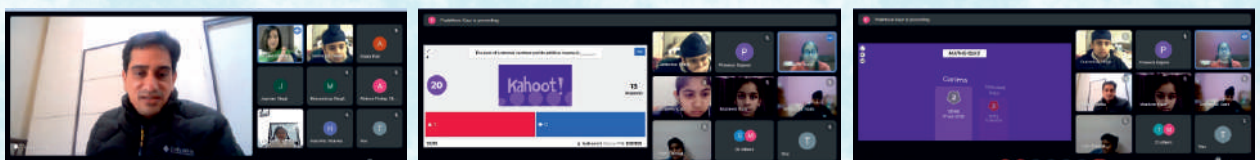
Mathematics department of SWS conducted a series of online quiz competitions from Classes 6-7 to evaluate the knowledge of the participants and promote a fun way of learning.

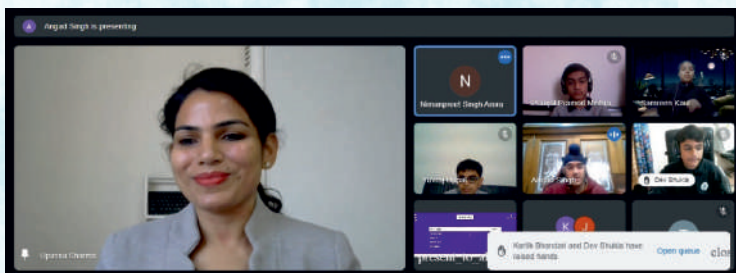
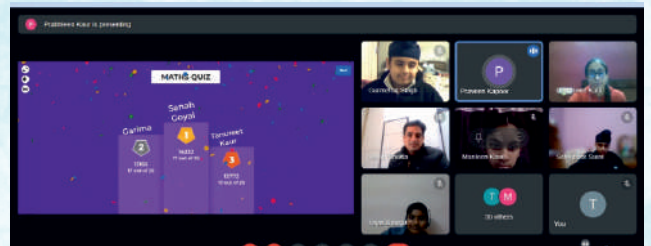
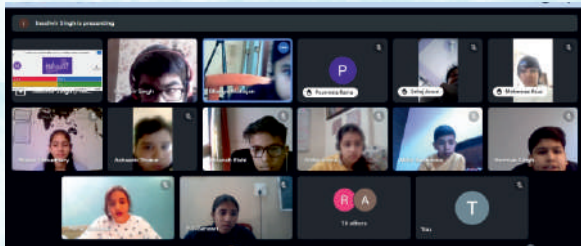
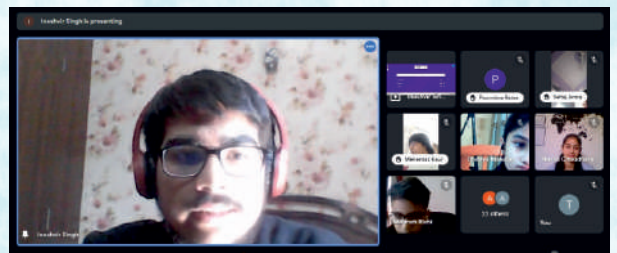
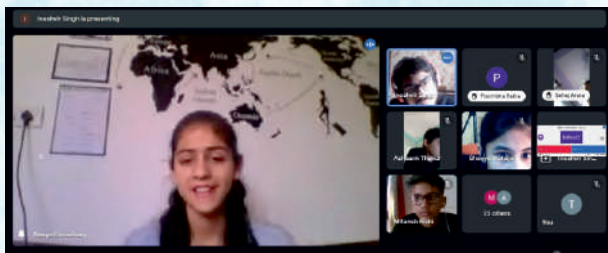
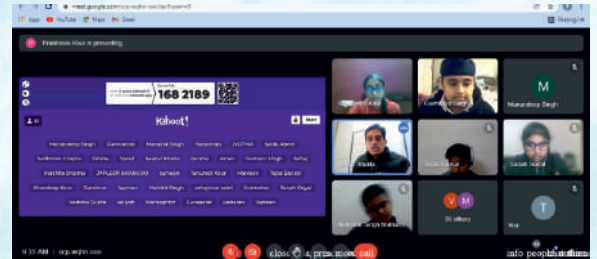
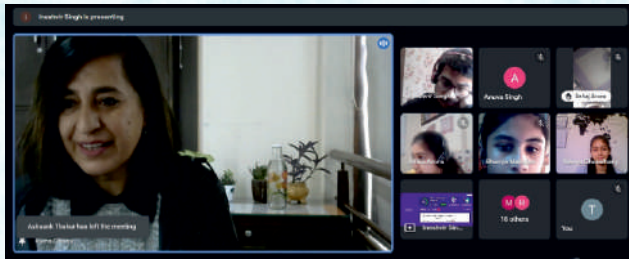

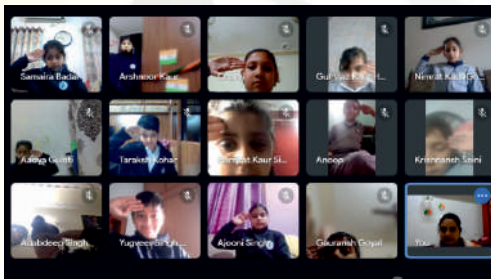




## Republic Day Assembly

'Freedom in the mind, strength in the words, pureness in our blood, pride in our souls and zeal in our hearts.'

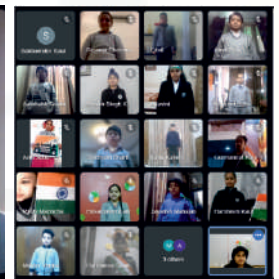

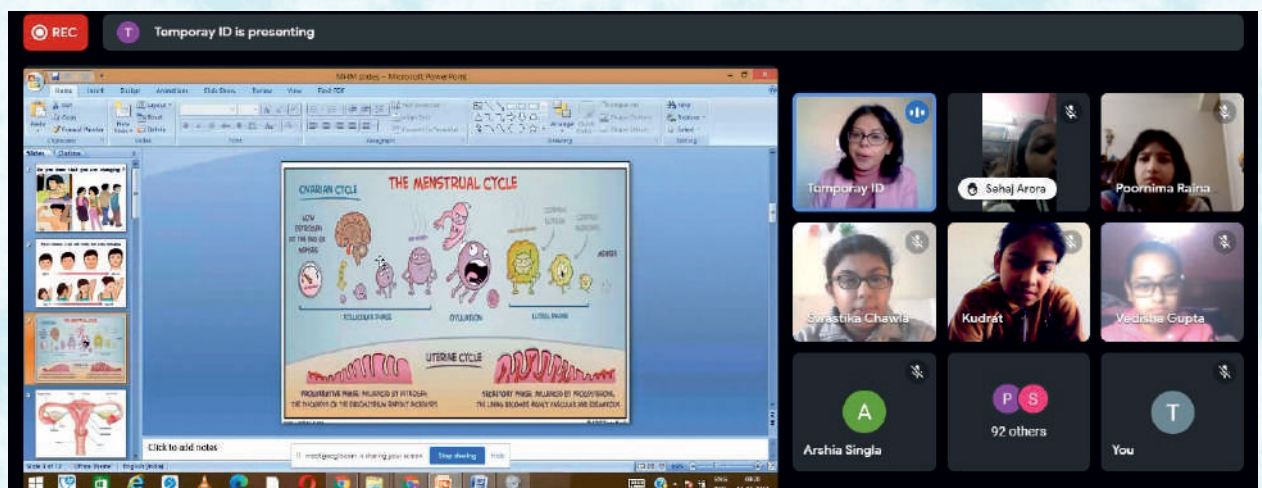
## Workshops on Child Safety
