


## Fun with English

## Let's Find out "Probability"

Students of Class 7 explored the concept of probability using equipments in the Mathematics lab. They found out the probability of various outcomes such as taking out a particular card from a pack, getting a specific coloured block, taking out a specific currency note from a bundle and probability of getting a head or a tail on a coin. The children also discussed about the activity and the probability of these events, which helped them in understanding the concepts.

## **Square Root Spiral activity**

To help the Class 9 students understand the concept of irrational numbers on the number line, a "Square Root Spiral" activity was organised for them. This spiral is formed by the chain of right angled triangles, which have a common side. The hypotenuse of one triangle becomes leg of the next. The free legs form the spiral. In the spiral, hypotenuse of each triangle is the square root of a number wherein the first triangle is always an isosceles triangle with hypotenuse equal to square root of 2. The other name of the Square Root Spiral is "Wheel of Theodorus or Einstein Spiral".

## Clubs of SWS

We, at SWS, believe in shaping our Wonderites to be all-rounders who are capable to take on any challenge in the real world. We have started various clubs this session to provide our students with ample opportunities to polish their skills. Students have a choice to opt for a club according to their preference and gain more knowledge. The names of the clubs being offered this session are: Legal Literacy Club, Eco Club, Heritage Club, Sewa Club and Language Literacy Club.

#### Legal Literacy Club

An Anti-Bullying Campaign was organised at SWS for students of Classes 3 to 10 as part of the Legal Literacy Club to make them aware about bullying and its negative effects that can leave a lasting impact on a person's life. The aim of organising the campaign was that students learn in a supportive, caring and safe environment without the fear of being bullied. Children were made aware that if they are being bullied, then they should communicate about it so that the incident can be dealt with promptly and effectively. Under the guidance of staff members of the club, pupils made posters and placards and went to different classes to spread awareness on the campaign.

#### **Counselling Session**

A counselling session was also conducted for students of Class 10 wherein they were made aware of their own feelings, emotions, stressors and personality. The session commenced with some deep breathing exercises for the students to connect with themselves and their inner emotions. Students were shown a video on how to train their subconscious mind, channel the immense energy they hold within, how to protect their aura and how to raise their vibrations so that they are calm and successful. The fruitful session concluded with a question-answer round.

#### ECO Club




#### **Heritage Club**

Heritage is the conceptual identity of an area that is handed down from the past and includes tangible heritage and intangible aspects like language, lifestyle, ceremonies, festivities, work culture, values, traditions, etc. The idea of setting up the Heritage Club was to bring history and social science curriculum alive for the students through active learning. In the first session, students were introduced to the club and its objective was explained. They were motivated to design an innovative logo which would express the club's concept.

A 'Textile Heritage' activity was also conducted to help students appreciate the rich and versatile heritage of textiles in India. The educators spoke about the various textiles used in the different parts of the country and made students understand how the fabrics are enriched with the multitude of designs influenced by God, flora, fauna, vegetation, climate, social, political and cultural environment etc. Children made the patterns of various fabrics on the political map of India and then labelled the states according to the fabric.

A Show and Tell was organised wherein students were assigned the topic 'Fabrics Have a Story to Tell'. Each student had to find a unique piece of fabric, either from their parents' wardrobe or the textile market, learn a little about its origins, and present their findings in front of the whole class.

## **Science Activities**

Students of Class 6 turned into little scientists and performed experiments to understand the concepts of sink and float and an electric circuit. For the first activity, they brought various materials from home that would either sink or float. This activity promoted scientific thinking as students were motivated to think about the cause and effect and note down observations, comparison, reasoning, experimentation and evaluation. For the second experiment, the pupils made a simple electric circuit using different components. They used the circuit as a tester to test the conductivity of various materials. At the end of the experiment, they got a better understanding of open and closed circuits.

## **Place Value Activity**






