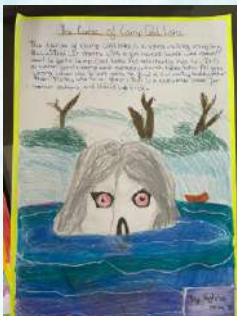

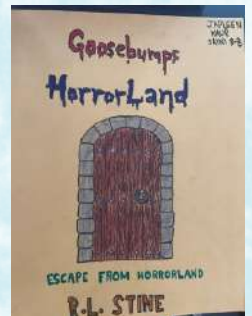

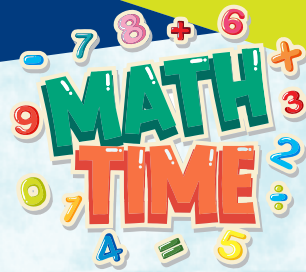

## Lab Experiments

In this manner, they were introduced and made aware of the various instruments and chemicals used in the science laboratory.

Children of Class 8 performed an activity to learn about the process of fermentation. They observed the raising of flour due to production of carbon dioxide and inflation of a balloon attached on a test tube due to fermentation. Students of Class 8 also took part in another activity where they were divided according to their houses and topics were allotted to them. Students composed a rap song and prepared a role play on microorganisms and diseases, respectively. The integration aimed to make the process of teaching learning effective.

Wonderites of Class 9 prepared a temporary mount of onion peel in their science period. The activity was demonstrated and students prepared the slide which was then observed under the microscope. The objective was to give them hands-on experience of plant cell observation.

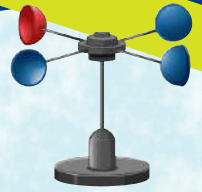
