Compost-Making Activity

Taking a step towards protecting our environment by reducing garbage loads and recycling the kitchen waste, a compost-making activity was performed by the green warriors of the Eco Club. Students along with their teachers learnt the combination of dry and wet waste used for composting. They were explained that regular composting enriches the soil and helps retain its moisture, while addressing pest issues and plant diseases. It reduces the need for chemical fertilizers by encouraging production of beneficial bacteria and fungi that break down organic matter to create humus, a rich, nutrient-filled material.

Meanwhile, children were also introduced to the importance of sustainability by means of an interesting game. They were told that sustainability is the key to a better future. As humans rely on natural resources for survival, ignoring sustainability can lead to the exhaustion of natural resources.













Activity on Spices

It is said that you learn better when you experience it. Proving this quote true, an interesting EVS activity was planned for the students of Class 4. We all know that taste is a very important sense due to its role in helping us determine the flavours of food and other substances. In fact, our ability to taste has historically been linked to our very survival, as our sense of taste gives us an indication of whether or not something is palatable. While studying the chapter of spices, students were given a real life experience of tasting 'Potato Chaat' and 'Fruit Salad', without adding spices, and then, after adding the spices. They were then asked to fill a template wherein they wrote feedback based on their reflections. Symmetry in Nature

If an object is symmetrical, it means that all its opposite sides are of the same size. Symmetry can be defined for both regular and irregular shapes. To give an insight into the environment and find symmetry in nature, a nature walk was conducted for the students of Class 4. 


