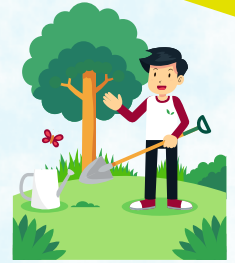

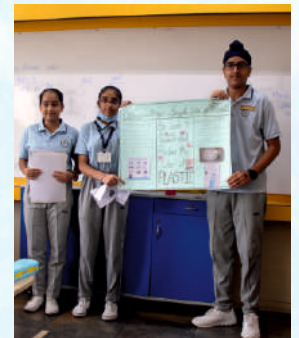


Swacchata Pakhwada

Fireless Cooking: Healthy Eating Habits

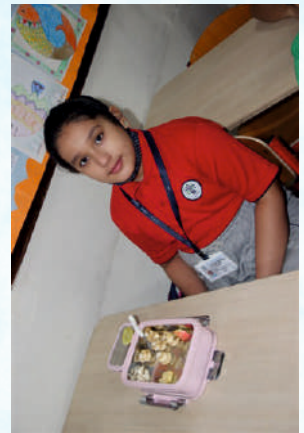
