Resuming Enrichment Activities in School

SWS has always believed in the importance of providing its students with opportunities to develop their interests and skills beyond academics. On that note, a wide range of Enrichment Activities including basketball, lawn tennis, photography, table tennis, contemporary dance, Punjabi dance, aerobics, Kathak, 3D design, chess, computer designing, taekwondo, theatre, and personality development have been reintroduced in this session. These activities provide students with a platform to explore their interests and develop new skills while promoting teamwork, creativity and sportsmanship. The school has invested in state-of-the-art facilities, including courts, equipment and trainers to provide an enjoyable experience for sports like basketball and lawn tennis. Photography has also gained popularity with students, learning the fundamentals of capturing moments and editing images.

The school has introduced various dance forms such as contemporary and Punjabi dance, to encourage students to express themselves through movement. Yoga and Aerobics focus on fitness and help students develop a healthy lifestyle. Kathak, a traditional Indian dance form, has been introduced to promote cultural learning and heritage.

The school has also introduced activities that promote creativity and technological skills. 3D design and computer designing provide students with an opportunity to design and create virtual models using software. Taekwondo, a Korean martial art, focuses on self-defense and physical conditioning. Personality development activities have also been introduced to help students improve their communication skills, develop a positive attitude and build self-confidence. These activities include public speaking, debating and leadership training.

The school has also introduced a 'Designers Den' program to encourage students to think creatively and develop innovative solutions to real-world problems. Art and craft activities have been introduced to promote creativity and allow students to express themselves through various mediums.

Speech is power: Speech is to persuade, to convert, to compel.




'A book is a gift that you can open again and again.'




