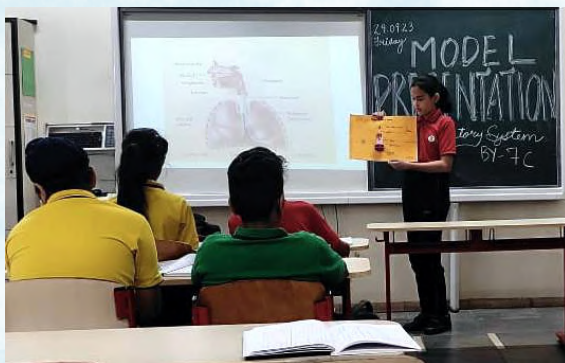

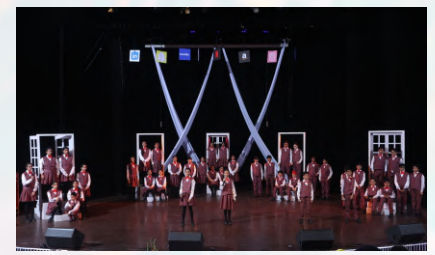
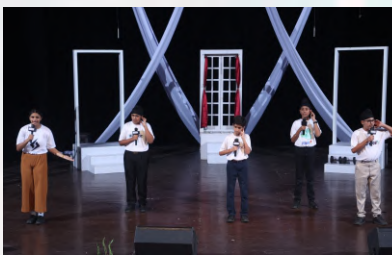

They are valued, not ignored.

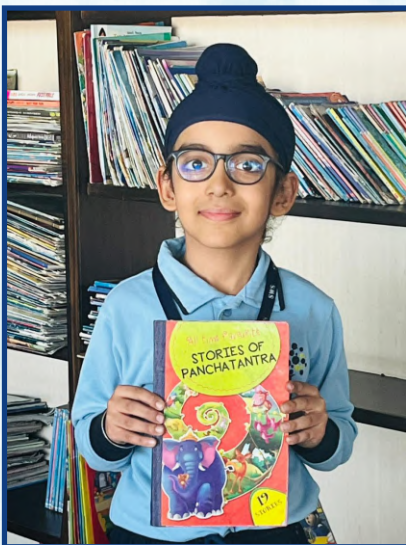
