Learning Teamwork & Cooperation⁺



Our enthusiastic students of Class 5 played Kho-Kho to display a perfect example of how sports are integrated with the EVS subject curriculum. They enjoyed the match and also understood and learnt some life skills like teamwork and cooperation. It was heartening to know that they figured out that practice and focus is the key to win any match.

Maths Activity - Exploring 兀

Learning by doing encourages active engagement of the learner in the process of exploring something. The students of Class 7 explored the concept 'Pi' through real life experiences. They took various circular objects and calculated the ratio of circumference to diameter in each case. They were excited to discover that it remains constant every time, i.e. 3.14 (approximately), and this value is called the 'Mathematical Constant π' .

In a subsequent session, they explored the area of a circle as well, and that of a parallelogram by performing paper cutting activities in the Math lab. The activities helped them learn the concept better by combining Mathematics and Art, which will then lead to long-lasting learning.


Assembly by Class 9A
