Class Activities

First Day in School for the Tiny Tots



On Day I, the induction programme begins with a warm welcome from the principal or senior staff, setting a positive tone for new students and their parents. This is followed by a brief overview of the school's facilities, rules, and values to ensure everyone feels comfortable and informed. Fun ice-breaking activities help children get acquainted, and guided tours introduce them to key areas like classrooms and playgrounds. In the afternoon, children participate in interactive games, storytelling, and music activities to stimulate their curiosity, while parents meet the teachers to discuss the curriculum. Children then explore their classrooms, familiarising themselves with their new learning spaces.

Day 2 starts with a circle time where students share their thoughts and experiences from the first day, fostering a sense of belonging. A basic daily routine, including snack and playtime, is introduced, along with simple classroom rules emphasising respect and cooperation. Creative activities like drawing and crafting promote self-expression. The afternoon features a story session to encourage imagination, followed by outdoor playtime for socialisation and motor skills development. Another parent-teacher interaction provides updates and answers to questions, and the day concludes with a closing circle where children reflect on their experiences. This induction programme ensures a smooth transition into the school environment, laying the groundwork for a positive and enriching experience.









First day of School - UKG and Class 1



All About Me

The "All About Me" activity was a delightful journey of self-discovery for our students of the Foundation Years, allowing them to communicate and connect with their classmates. Students were encouraged to express themselves through various activities like circle time, artistic expressions, and illustrations, covering various aspects of their lives, including their hobbies, favourite colours, food, animals, etc.

This activity served as a valuable opportunity for students to embark on a journey of self-discovery and mutual understanding. Sense Stations - Exploring our five senses

Our senses open the door to a world filled with rich experiences. Whether savouring diverse cuisines, inhaling soothing scents, or feeling the warmth of a touch, our senses bring joy to our lives.

To introduce the students to the wonders of the human senses, an activity called 'Five Sense Stations' was designed for students of Grade 1. The educators created five distinct sense stations, each engaging and enlightening.

At these stations, our young learners had hands-on encounters with the fundamental function of each sense organ. After experiencing them, they shared their learning through beautiful illustrations.

This interactive activity effectively instilled an understanding of the five sense organs in the students and honed their ability to observe and appreciate the role of each sense in their daily lives, reinforcing the concept of our five senses.







Model Making Activity

In accordance with the NEP Guidelines, an art-integrated activity of model making was conducted by the students of Grade 5 in EVS. The activity deepened their understanding of the concept regarding different kinds of houses with respect to diverse geographical terrains. This experiential learning-based activity (learning by doing) brought creativity to their abstract knowledge and improved their communication skills as they demonstrated their models in the class. They explained in detail how the design and materials used in houses across multiple geographical regions are related to climatic conditions, the materials available, and the ways they help people stay comfortable.

It was a great learning experience for them.



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Math Activity by Class 4

At SWS, Mohali, we have redefined the landscape of mathematics education by embracing a manipulativebased learning approach. Departing from traditional methods that often relied on rote memorisation, we firmly believe in the power of *experiential tools to cultivate a deep understanding of mathematical concepts.*

The students revised all the concepts learned in the Chapter- Large Numbers - with the help of "Place Value Project"

In our commitment to fostering conceptual understanding, the projects on Place Value were made by the students. This project work serves as bridges between abstract concepts and real-world applications, providing students with a hands-on experience that goes beyond memorisation.

One of the hallmarks of our approach is the promotion of a collaborative learning environment. Through the use of projects, our students are encouraged to engage in discussions and share their discoveries with their peers. This collaborative exchange of ideas not only enriches the learning experience but also cultivates communication and teamwork skills.

Students at SWS, Mohali, are not merely recipients of information but active participants in their educational journey. The joy of discovery and exploration becomes a constant companion in their mathematical endeavours.











Circle Time

We organised "Circle Time" to cultivate a deeper sense of emotional awareness and connection among students in Classes 6 to 10. This intentional practice served as a platform for students to come together, speak openly about their feelings, and support one another's growth and happiness.

During Circle Time, students took turns speaking about their problems, thoughts, and experiences. This encouraged them to articulate their emotions, leading to greater self-awareness and understanding. Moreover, hearing their peers' perspectives helped cultivate empathy and compassion among classmates. By sharing their struggles and triumphs, students learned to empathise with one another and offer words of encouragement and support. This collective sharing helped create a sense of belonging and strengthened the classroom community.

Math Quiz for Classes 6 - 10

Quiz contests are an effective way to evaluate understanding and bridge the gap between theory and practical application, encouraging students to broaden their knowledge beyond the classroom. Recently, we held a math quiz for grades 6 to 10, featuring separate teams for each grade range. Teams from Oak, Aspen, Cedar, and Maple houses eagerly joined in for an hour of spirited competition. The contest included diverse rounds covering general questions, visual puzzles, aptitude tests, and rapid-fire challenges, offering a comprehensive assessment of students' comprehension. The event drew an enthusiastic audience, with students cheering on their peers across different grades. Ultimately, Oak house triumphed in Grades 9 and 10, while Aspen house claimed victory in Grades 6 to 8. Our goal in organising this contest was to encourage creativity, teamwork, academic assessment, and knowledge sharing among students of varying ages, fostering healthy competition and camaraderie among participants.

Engaging Math Activity - Act Out a Word Problem

Introduction


