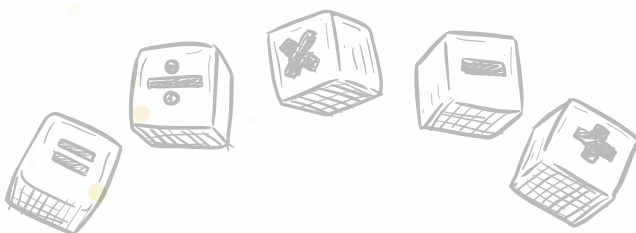


Functional Math Four Operation Calculator Models Crafted at SWS

EBSB Project (Comparision of Staple Food of Punjab and Odisha) by Class 6

Students conducted a group project comparing the staple foods of Punjab and Odisha, defining staple food as that which forms a significant portion of a population's diet. Working in groups of four, they researched and collected data on commonly consumed food items in both regions, tabulating their nutritional value including percentages of carbohydrates, proteins, and fats. In class, students presented their findings confidently using models and pictorial representations on A3 sheets. Through this project, students developed valuable skills such as problem-solving, time management, and collaboration, while also gaining an understanding of the role different foods play in meeting the body's nutritional needs.



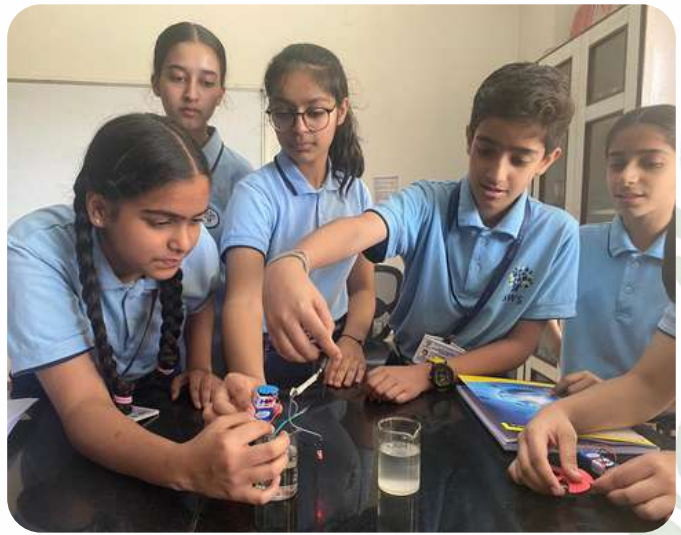

Science Activity by Class 8A and 8B

Students of Classes 8A and 8B conducted an experiment to determine whether a liquid is an electrolyte or non-electrolyte. Using a battery, wire, bulb, and switch, they constructed a tester and tested various liquids by connecting them to the free end. This hands-on activity aimed to enhance students' observational and inquiry skills, fostering a deeper understanding of scientific concepts.

Class 9 conducted an experiment to distinguish between homogeneous and heterogeneous mixtures using iron filings and sulphur powder. This practical activity aimed to help students understand that mixtures consist of two or more components with varying compositions, properties, and methods of separation. Through hands-on exploration, students gained insights into the characteristics and behavior of different types of mixtures.

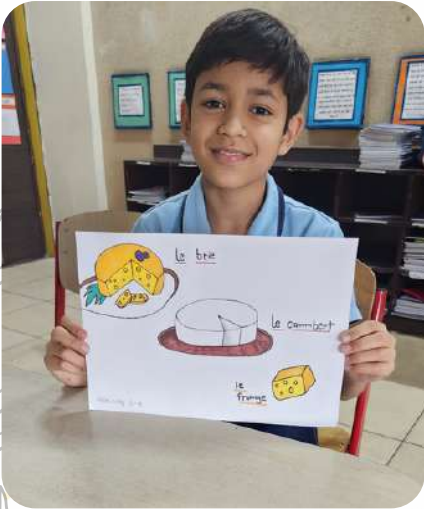
