














A refreshing and recreational walk in the rain

We are proud to announce that our Science Club students have successfully developed bioplastic using starch and vinegar. This project showcases their ingenuity and commitment to environmental sustainability.

ACTIVITY: Exploring Attractive Forces at the Liquid-Air Interface

In this exciting session, students investigated the intriguing forces at the surface of liquids. The activity focused on understanding surface tension and how molecules at the liquid's surface interact with each other and the surrounding air. Students engaged in hands-on experiments to manipulate surface tension and observe its effects on the shape and behaviour of liquid surfaces.

ACTIVITY: Balloon Car - Understanding Newton's Third Law of Motion

In this hands-on activity, students explored Newton's Third Law of Motion. Seminar on Drug Abuse




