# Experiments and Discoveries

## Exploring Floatation



On 20th November, the students of Class 5 conducted an experiment in the Science lab to observe how different objects behave in water. They collected various items such as a rubber ball, stone, leaf, coin, nail, plastic bottle, sea shells, plastic container, a soap, wooden block etc and gently placed each one in a container of water. The class carefully noted which objects floated on the surface, which ones sank to the bottom and the ones remained in the middle. Through this activity, they discovered that objects made of lighter materials, like wood and rubber, usually float, while heavier and denser objects, like stones and coins, tend to sink. The experiment helped them understand the concept of floatation in a simple and engaging way.





# Assemblies

## United We Stand, United We Pray

### Gurpurab

The senior students organized a serene Gurpurab assembly to commemorate the birth anniversary of Guru Nanak Dev Ji, featuring shabads, prayers, poems on his teachings, and short plays highlighting values like unity and service. These assemblies emphasize Guru Nanak's principles of compassion, humility, and community service, often concluding with motivational messages for students.





## Constitution of India

Students of the Senior Wing presented an engaging assembly on the Constitution of India, focusing on its drafting by the Constituent Assembly from 1946 to 1950, led by figures like Dr. B.R. Ambedkar. Key highlights include its adoption on November 26, 1949, with 395 articles promoting justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity, adaptable through amendments. The program featured skits on historical milestones, recitations of the Preamble, and discussions on its role in India's democracy. Teachings of oneness and equality to the Constitution's core values for a unified assembly script include student-led pledges to embody both spiritual harmony and constitutional duties. They concluded with a combined prayer or anthem reinforcing national and cultural pride .





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
