ENVIRONMENT WEEK (Thursday, 2nd July 2026 to Saturday, 4th July 2026)

To promote environmental awareness and responsible citizenship, the school will observe Environment Week from 02–04 July 2026. Students are encouraged to participate enthusiastically in the following activities.

Classes 3–5

- **01–04 July: No Foil Week Campaign** – Students should avoid bringing food wrapped in aluminum foil. Class audits will be conducted to encourage participation.
- **02 July:** All students are required to: 1. Plant a sapling. 2. Click a photograph while planting it. 3. Submit a printout of the photograph. 4. The print will be filed in the individual student's House Activity record.
- **03 July:** Recycling Newspaper Activity – Create environmental slogans and messages on old newspapers to promote reuse and recycling.

Classes 6–8

- **01–04 July:** My 4-Day Pledge for the Planet – Students will undertake one eco-friendly action each day (waste segregation, plastic collection, water conservation, etc.).
- **02 July:** 1. Plant a sapling. 2. Click a photograph while planting it. 3. Submit a printout of the photograph. 4. The print will be filed in the individual student's House Activity record.
- **03 July: Upcycled Fashion** – Design a bag, hat, or useful item using old newspapers or cloth.

Class 8	Draw a face in which each feature represents a different Indian art or cultural tradition (e.g., Warli eyes, Gond hair, Madhubani nose).
